I don't know what happened to Doug Ford when he lost to Kathleen Wynne, but his gradual drift into incoherence over the past year is more puzzling than anything. When Ford first got elected, it seemed to me that the main problem was that he was oblivious to most of what was going on. I thought that, for example, he was too reluctant to criticize the Ontario Liberals (he was against a number of their flagship policies), or that he saw himself more as a nice, normal guy trying to balance the budget (spending more on health care, for example) than as a firebrand conservative. A month or two into his mandate, however, I got the sense that his cluelessness had turned to anger, and that, like his father's infamous "tax cuts, they never took place" campaign, the forcefulness of his position on certain issues was driven as much by stubbornness as by ideology. Ford has been pretty consistent on his vow not to raise taxes. One of the main campaign promises of his 2010 election campaign was to cut the size of the public sector by 10 per cent, to eliminate the previous Liberal government's multibillion-dollar deficit and restore fiscal sanity to Queen's Park. He and his brother have a pretty impressive track record of getting stuff done as far as that's concerned. It was clear right away that Ford's government was going to get a drubbing in the 2012 election, and Ford realized he had to find a more moderate policy to run on, so he ditched his previous promise to kill public-sector job cuts. So he did what any sensible conservative would do in that situation, and he offered a balanced budget, albeit one that relied on small, incremental budget cuts and increased revenues. You could say he's consistent in that respect too. Ford was also consistent in saying that the people who elected him were fine with his plan for the budget. "Ninety-nine per cent of the people of Ontario want balanced budgets. If they don't like it, they can always change the government." So when Ford was first elected, I had the sense that
